

How can we be certain of God's authority and power behind Scripture? Isaiah 40:8, "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the Word of our God stands forever."

Psalms 19:7, "The law of the LORD *is* perfect, converting the soul; the testimony of the LORD *is* sure, making wise the simple."

Psalms 119:142, "Your righteousness *is* an everlasting righteousness, and Your law *is* truth."

Psalms 119:151, "You *are* near, O LORD, and all Your commandments *are* truth."

The reason why the apostle Paul said:

1 Thessalonians 2:13, "For this reason we also thank God without ceasing, because when you received the Word of God which you heard from us, you welcomed *it* not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the Word of God, which also effectively works in you who believe."

What did Jesus declare on the authority of God's Word?

John 17:17, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your Word is truth."

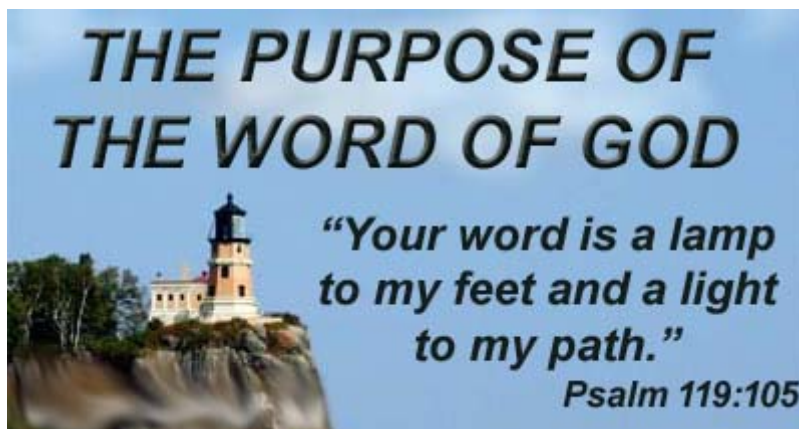
As such, Jesus revealed with authority and power:

John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

John 8:12, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

Have I embraced Christ, the Word of God, as the anchor and authority of my faith?

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What is the core purpose of Scripture for humanity?

2 Timothy 3:16-17, “All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.”

As such:

Joshua 1:8, “This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.”

Why?

Romans 15:4, “For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.”

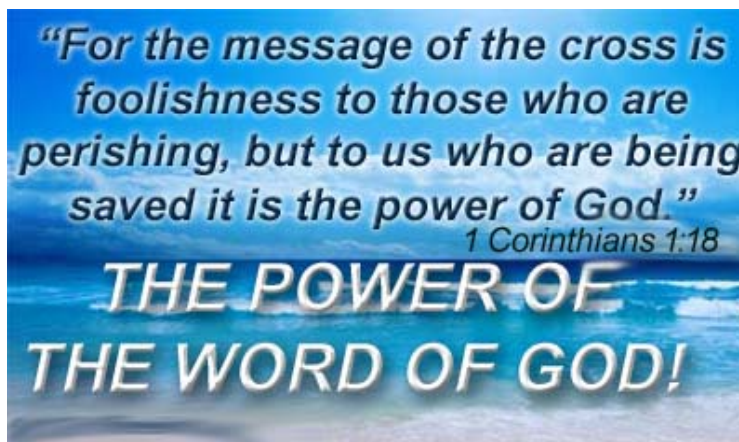
2 Corinthians 10:4-5, “For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ.”

In Jesus’ own words:

John 5:24, “He who hears My Word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.”

How committed am I to study the Word of God, so I live to truly abide in Christ?

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How powerful is the Word of God in the life of a believer?

Hebrews 4:12, "The Word of God *is* living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

As such:

Isaiah 55:11, "So shall My Word be that goes forth from My mouth; it shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper *in the thing* for which I sent it."

1 Peter 1:24-25, "All flesh *is* as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of the grass. The grass withers, and its flower falls away, but the Word of the LORD endures forever."

Psalms 19:7-8, "The law of the LORD *is* perfect, converting the soul; the testimony of the LORD *is* sure, making wise the simple; the statutes of the LORD *are* right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the LORD *is* pure, enlightening the eyes."

What's more?

Romans 1:16, "It is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes."

Therefore:

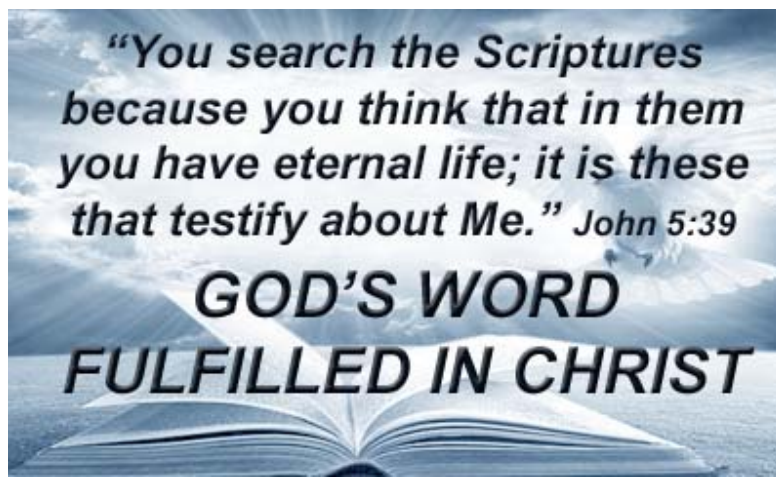
Matthew 4:4, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God."

As a result:

Romans 10:17, "Faith *comes* by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God."

How strong is my faith in God's Word to powerfully impact my life?

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How does Scripture testify that Christ is the fulfillment of prophecies of the Old Testament?

John 1:1-3, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made."

John 1:14, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."

Hebrews 1:1-2, "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by *His* Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds."

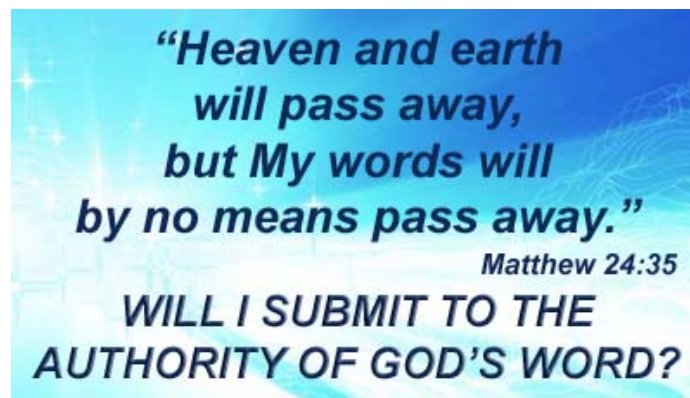
As such Jesus declared:

Matthew 5:17-18, "Do not presume that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish, but to fulfill. For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke of a letter shall pass from the Law, until all is accomplished!"

Revelation 1:18, "I *am* He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death."

How surrendered am I to Christ, so His Word bring the fulfillment of God's plan for my life?

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How faithful to God’s Word must we be as true believers in Christ?  
Proverbs 30:5-6, “Every Word of God *is* pure; He *is* a shield to those who put their trust in Him. Do not add to His words, lest He rebuke you, and you be found a liar.”

2 John 9, “Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son.”

And as Jesus said:

John 12:28, “He who rejects Me, and does not receive My words, has that which judges him—the Word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day.”

Therefore:

James 1:22, “Be doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”

2 Timothy 2:15, “Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.”

What’s more?

Deuteronomy 4:2, “You shall not add to the Word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you.”

1 Peter 4:11, “If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ.”

How faithful am I to abide in Christ?

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
